PRESIDENT REPORT

The Rams have had a good year on the field, with the Firsts and the Thirds finishing on top, but both lucked out, neither making it to the Grand Final and a couple of Junior premierships on Friday Night. The Firsts number one finish means the Club has been promoted to Division One next year. Our young group of players in the Firsts will have to step up again next year to consolidate their position in Division One. Baseball Victoria has proposed radical changes to the structure of the Summer League competition. These changes were proposed for the 2013-14 season, but have been delayed by one season. The Club needs to consolidate its position to ensure that it is well placed for the restructuring.

The Club has remained in a weak financial position. The financial reports reveal a low bank balance, which has reduced over the last year by the amount that was spent on the upgrades to the ground and the rising costs of running the Club and 14 teams. With the planned changes to progress the Club into the future we need to find sustainable ways to increase the Clubs income.

The Club did not have a Major sponsor this season. There are a growing number of minor sponsors which must be nurtured to fill the void if we do not have a major sponsor.

Bob Milne has left a substantial legacy to the Club. A sub committee was formed at last year's AGM to review possible uses for the money and to provide options to the Committee of Management. The preferred option has been implemented. This Strategy will enable Bob Milne's legacy to benefit the members of the Newport Baseball Club for the next 40 years plus. An investment account has been set up which can only be operated by a Trio of Trustees who are all Life Members of the Club. A portion of the profit on investments will be made available each year and the Bob Milne sub-committee, in conjunction with the Committee will decide on projects within the Club to fund. The initial projects are starting this winter. Look out for the new stairs to the scorer's box.

The Clubrooms and facilities are looking exceptional. The only items left on the redevelopment plans are the new front entrance through the current storeroom next to the bar and the development of a Committee Room in the current foyer and office.

I apologise if I miss anyone, but I would like to highlight some of the Clubs achievements and individual efforts, which featured over the last year.

Grant Weir in his second season as Club Baseball Coach has led the team to a first place finish. Grant has continued his work in training and moulding our young senior squad. Congratulations to Grant and his assistant Gavin Young for their efforts this season.

The Thirds finished on top, but could not carry their good form through, losing both finals. Congratulations to Stewie Jeffrey for managing the team and the players for a good season.

There was no Kitchen Manager this season and the time consuming task of buying all the stock was taken on by Karen Van Wyngaarden. Karen also helped set up and serve on game days as well as organising and serving Tuesday Night meals after training. For her commitment to the Club over the past couple of seasons Karen was awarded the Currie Memorial Trophy for Best Clubman.

Alan King once again put in many hours managing and serving behind the bar including game days and training. Alan has decided to resign from his role in the Club and the Club thanks him for his many years of service.

The Junior Sub Committee was headed by the Junior Manager, Alan Condie. The members were, Caron Condie, Paul Walshe, Jacinta Edwards, and the new addition Leanne Wilson. They put in a high level of effort in managing the juniors, which has maintained junior player numbers over 100, including the rally cap program for the training of 5 to 8 year olds. The current training program for all the juniors based on progressing through skills stations has proven to be popular with the players and is improving their skill levels.

Congratulations to the premiership winners: the West Centre Under 14 Rams team and the West Centre Under 12 Pistons. The West Centre Under 12 Rams in the were Runners Up to the Pistons.

The following players represented the Club in State Junior Baseball teams this season: Jeremy Young (U18Blue), Cameron McNish (U18Blue), Tyson Foreman (U18White), Jamie Young (U14Blue), Angus Edwards (U14White), Kirsten Bezzina (U15 Girls) and Britney Cedelland (U15 Girls). The Clubs other state representative was Leslie Anglin who played in the Victorian Women's Team. Tania Capovilla and Angus Robinson played for the Western Mets and Jaidyn Wilson and Nathan Bezzina played for the Bellarine Rays in the State Little League Championship.

The Masters Baseballers enjoyed another Monday night season. The team was in Division 2 North West, finishing fourth, but losing their semi-final. Thanks to Alan Bunting for organising the team. The highlight of the season was the introduction of the New "Old School" grey playing tops.

The Club has continued the junior winter baseball teams in 2013 with one under 14 team and one under 12 team. In 2012 the two under 14 teams played off in the Grand Final with Paul Walshe's Rams winning and Jeff Morrisons Pistons runners up. Caron Condie coached the under 12 team to the premiership. The Club needs to run over the winter to stop other sports from requesting use of our grounds, as well as the financial advantages from using the facilities all year round. To that end Northcote Baseball Club has started its third season playing on our fields. There are many familiar Newport faces in the Northcote team and the arrangement may continue over future winter seasons.

Jacinta Edwards was coerced onto the Committee this year in the position of Activities Manager, while remaining on the junior sub-committee. Jacinta was a bit apprehensive about being able to do the job but with a bit of help from Paul Walshe, put in a fantastic effort including our first ever Pirate Function. Jacinta and Paul combined on many projects such as cleaning out the office and storerooms, with their best achievement being the organisation of the memorabilia display in the back room.

Paul Walshe re-joined the committee in a familiar role as the Club Manager as well as continuing in his role as Grounds Manager, putting in many hours during the day on the grounds.

I would like to thank all other office bearers for their many hours of time and effort and support over the year. Thanks to all the junior and senior team coaches, managers and scorers for their efforts. Thanks to the parents and supporters who served in the kitchen and bar and other jobs around the Club. Like all amateur sporting clubs the only way to keep costs down is to use our volunteer's time.

Our current challenge is to maintain our high number of junior players and to balance our budget so that we can keep our costs down for our members. Money from the Bob Milne Legacy will ensure that there is constant improvement in our facilities.

I was elected President (unopposed) in 2000. The Firsts had just won the Division 2 Premiership and we were heading to Division One. We are in a similar position this year. This plus the proposed restructuring of the summer competition could mean that fundamental changes to how the club operates may be needed. I have had 13 years as President and 21 years straight on the Committee and I feel it is time to step aside for someone with renewed energy for the position to lead us though any changes required. Becoming a family man has limited the amount of time I wanted to spend around the Club in the last couple of years. I will still be an active Club Member and as I still have a goal to play baseball forever I will be at the Club for many years yet.

Finally, I thank Nat and the girls for their support and patience throughout the year.

I have enjoyed the past 12 months as NBC Club Manager. With enormous support from Jacinta Edwards and other anonymous people, we as a Club have achieved quite a lot. Thank you to the NBC Committee for your support to allow me to continue to represent NBC. Thanks to Kim and the boys who "allow" me the time spend at NBC contributing to our great Club.

Prior to the commencement of the summer season we implemented a plan to clean out a number of areas within the Club that had become difficult to work in and were stifling forward progress. This included: the cleaner's room, the back area behind the bar, the cool room storage area and the office otherwise known as *'the black hole'*. Not only was it a good time to throw out some accumulated clutter and improve the workability of the areas, it also enabled us to re-discover some great Club Memorabilia not seen in some time. This project set the tone to *"get things done"* over the summer.

We were very happy to welcome on board some new Club Sponsors in both financial sponsorship as well as service providers. New storage areas for playing and ground equipment directly accessible from outside made everything very workable and really started to put a polish on our already great facilities.

Two of the main income streams we have are the kitchen and bar so it is important they are managed efficiently to maximise their potential. Once again Jordon Pengelly took the role of bar manager and made certain we were always well stocked with a variety of refreshments, this included being able to host a number of private functions held at NBC. Well done Jordo. The same can be said about Karen Van Wyngaarden and her efforts in keeping the kitchen fully stocked with drinks, food and lollies across the summer. Plans are now well advanced to have a suitable door installed to the Hall of Fame room so it can be secured when NBC is used for private functions.

Life Members Day was also a day to re-commemorate the L.R. 'Bob' Milne Field by laying some of Bob's ashes under the home plate. This was a very special moment acknowledging the rich history of NBC and was very well received. There was a great turnout of life members and they were all suitably impressed by the continuing improvement of our facilities both in and outside. Whilst the large turnout of life members may be directly attributed to the occasion of laying of Bob's ashes, there has been some good planning for future life member's days to include past players and sponsors such as the "Heritage Days" held by other sporting clubs. Over the next couple of years NBC will be investing in continued improvement to our rooms to increase the number of private functions we can attract, and therefore increasing the clubs income. - Three Under 12 teams in the Friday night area centre competition two of these making the grand final.
- One Under 12 team in the Major League Sunday competition
- One Under 14 team in the Friday night area centre competition winning the premiership
- Two Under 14 teams in the Sunday competition
- One Under 16 team making the semi finals
- One Under 18 team combined with some really great players and parents from Geelong – making the semi finals
- Currently we have two winter teams (1 x U12& 1 x U14)

Of course as we continue with substantial growth comes the need for more coaches, scorers and support staff; we know this is a regular line in all reports and other forums, but it is a fact of any sports club. There is no point in the Club continuing to grow its junior numbers if we cannot give them the high standard of baseball experience that NBC currently provides.

It has been great to see a couple of new coaches this past season as well as some new parents taking up the pencils and learning to score. In addition to this a number of the coaches & scorers have been people relatively new to the Club, which is great.
